India is a rich source of the goat gene pool; there are 37 breeds of goat recognized by the National Bureau of Animal Genetic Resources, Karnal (NBAGR, 2023). Goat rearing in India is a very successful enterprise with minimal investment. Goat farming may be done on a local or huge industrial scale. Goats are referred as the "poor man's cow" since they offer high returns and may be used as an investment source. Sojat goat farming may be the turning point in goat rearing in Rajasthan. Sojat goats, which are huge and dual-purpose, are dispersed in Rajasthan's Pali, Jodhpur, Nagaur, and Jaisalmer districts.

Characteristics of Sojat goat

- The coat is white with brown patches on the head, neck, ears, and legs, however pure white coat also found in the field.
- > The ears are very long, flat, and drooping.
- > Wattles are present in majority of females while completely absent in males.
- The horns are curved and downward oriented, twisted in females while males are completely polled.
- Average adult weight is about 60.0 kg in males and 53.0 kg in females.
- > Average daily milk yield = 1060.12 ± 12.59 gm
- > Lactation milk yield = 266.64 ± 0.63 kg
- > Lactation length = 232.92 ± 1.17 days
